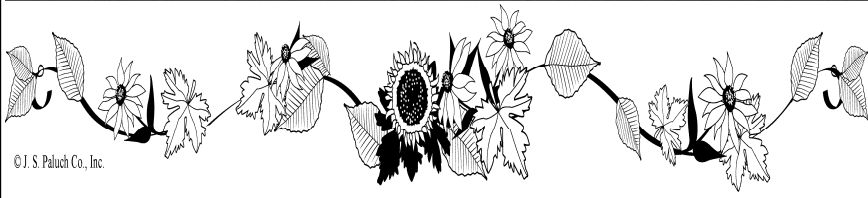

## Treasures From Our Tradition

In recent decades, attention has shifted away from headgear as a symbol of a bishop's authority to a more substantial symbol: the chair, called the *cathedra*. The word comes from the Latin word for a chair with armrests. It is exactly the reason why dining room sets were marketed in this country a few years ago with only one chair with armrests, the captain's chair. In many rectories of a certain vintage, you will see only one chair with arms at the dining table, a sign to the assisting priests of their proper place in the constellation. For us, as with most Anglicans and some Lutherans, the *cathedra* is a sign of the teaching authority of the bishop. We inherited the symbolism of the chair from Roman civil life in the fourth century. A church that houses a *cathedra* is called a cathedral, and the chair may be used only by the bishop of that diocese. Priests who preside at liturgy there must use a different presidential chair.

You may find the *cathedra* in its most traditional place at the head of the apse, or against a side wall as was favored in medieval times, but increasingly bishops are locating the *cathedra* in the midst of the assembly of the faithful. In the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, visitors will find no barrier to their trying out the *cathedra*, an expression of hospitality that helps the archbishop be mindful of those whom he serves.

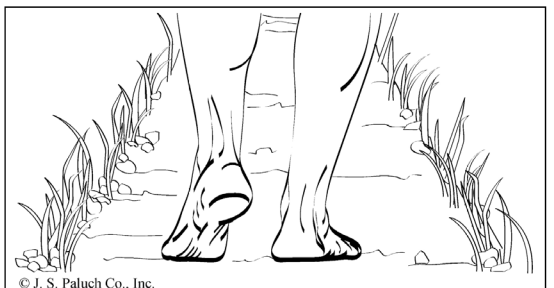

## LITURGY MATTERS

### The Communion Rite

Since the celebration of the Eucharist is the Paschal Banquet, it is desirable that in accordance with the Lord's command his Body and Blood should be received as spiritual food by those of the faithful who are properly disposed. This is the sense of the fraction and the other preparatory rites by which the faithful are led more immediately to Communion.



### The Lord's Prayer

In the Lord's Prayer a petition is made for daily bread, which for Christians means principally the Eucharistic Bread, and entreating also purification from sin, so that what is holy may in truth be given to the holy. The Priest pronounces the invitation to the prayer, and all the faithful say the prayer with him; then the Priest alone adds the embolism, which the people conclude by means of the doxology. The embolism, developing the last petition of the Lord's Prayer itself, asks for deliverance from the power of evil for the whole community of the faithful. The invitation, the Prayer itself, the embolism, and the doxology by which the people conclude these things are sung or are said aloud.

### The Rite of Peace

There follows the Rite of Peace, by which the Church entreats peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the Sacrament. As for the actual sign of peace to be given, the manner is to be established by the Conferences of Bishops in accordance with the culture and customs of the peoples. However, it is appropriate that each person, in a sober manner, offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest.

### El Rito de la Comunión

*Desde la celebración de la Eucaristía es el banquete pascual, es deseable que, de conformidad con el mandato del Señor a su cuerpo y la sangre deben ser recibidos como alimento espiritual por los de los fieles bien dispuestos. Este es el sentido de la fracción y los demás ritos preparatorios a que los fieles son guiados de manera más inmediata a la comunión.*

### La oración del Señor

*En la oración del Señor se hace una petición para pan de cada día, lo que significa para los cristianos, principalmente el Pan eucarístico, y rogativo también la purificación del pecado, de modo que lo que es santo en mayo de verdad se dará a la santa. El sacerdote pronuncia la invitación a la oración, y todos los fieles dicen que la oración con él; entonces el sacerdote solo añade el embolismo, que las personas llegan a la conclusión por medio de la doxología. El embolismo, que desarrolla la última petición de la propia oración del Señor, pide la liberación del poder del mal para toda la comunidad de los fieles. La invitación, la oración misma, el embolismo y la doxología por el cual las personas llegan a la conclusión de estas cosas se cantan o se dice en voz alta.*

### El rito de la paz

*A continuación el rito de la paz, por el que la Iglesia implora la paz y la unidad para sí misma y para toda la familia humana, y el expreso fieles el uno al otro su comunión eclesial y la mutua caridad, antes de comulgar en el Sacramento. En cuanto a la muestra real de la paz que ha de darse, es la forma que establezca la Conferencia de Obispos de acuerdo con la cultura y costumbres de los pueblos. Sin embargo, es conveniente que cada persona, de una manera sobria, ofrecen el signo de la paz sólo a aquellos que están más cerca.*

### The Struggle

Mother Teresa—a saint for our times. She began religious life as a teacher in Calcutta, India, where she was shocked by the dismal poverty beyond the school. In 1948 she left teaching for a new calling: to serve the destitute in Calcutta's slums. Other women joined her, forming the Missionaries of Charity. At her death, Mother Teresa was world-renowned for her compassion. A recent book contains letters she wrote to advisors and friends, which reveal that she lived for years in a spiritual desert. She longed for God, but felt no faith, love, or fervor. Her smile masked an emptiness: if there is no God, there is no Jesus Christ. She died with her doubts in 1997. Atheists declared that the letters prove that religion is a sham. We who struggle with faith call her heroic for doing God's will in spite of spiritual darkness. Her dying wish was for the destruction of her letters, but the Church decided to keep them. Perhaps now we know why.

### Discipline

It is no accident that the words "disciple" and "discipline" are nearly identical. Our discipline is more like that of an athlete pursuing a victory or a personal best, or a musician striving for a concert career or to master a new piece of music. This discipline comes from desire, not from regulations. It was the desire to do the will of God that led Jesus on the path to his cross. It is that same desire he encourages in us today: to strive to enter through the narrow gate, to find ourselves in the kingdom with a surprising assortment of people who are there not because of mere observation of rules, but out of a genuine desire to recline at the table of the heavenly banquet.
